Fast and lively, but well mannered; the Albacore is a boat that is both simple to learn in, but will challenge your tuning and tactical skills for the rest of your life.



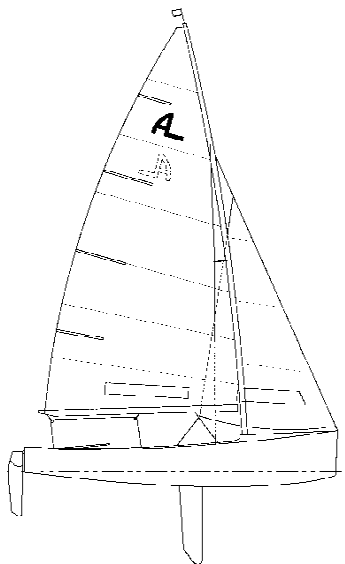

The Albacore is a "restricted" class with tight specifications on hull shape, sail plan, and centreboard shape while leaving the options for rigging & sail controls open to the individual sailor. There are a great many variations in rigging systems to suit your needs.
